- Contested Land, Contested Memory: Israel's Jews and Arabs and the Ghosts of Catastrophe by Jo Roberts (Dundurn, 2013) 304 pages, SCL*
 Vividly narrated, with extensive original interview material, it examines how these tangled histories of suffering inform Jewish and Palestinian-Israeli lives today, and frame Israel's possibilities for peace. - http://amzn.to/1KQ2Mhy
- The Golden Age Shtetl: A New History of Jewish Life in East Europe by Yohanan Petrovsky-Shtern (Princeton University, 2014) 448 pages, SCL*

 Klorman (Brill, 2014) 223 pages
 An account of the circumstances of Yemeni Jewish existence in the wake of major changes
 since the second half of the 19th century. It follows this community's transition from a traditional

 A selection of articles by scholars on the social and cultural situation of Turkish Jews in the last two decades. Tensions created by political events in Turkey and/or by the Israeli-Palestian
- The Underground: The untold story of how a handful of Jews helped spark a spiritual revolution in the Soviet Union by Yaakov Astor, Rabbi Mordechai Neustadt (Judaica Press, 2014) 472 pages
 - Two great catastrophes befell the Jewish people in the 20th century -- The Holocaust and the destruction of Jewish life in the Soviet Union, behind the "Iron Curtain."
